## Roundup and read this...

#### Do not use *Roundup* or *any chemical* on creek banks and drainage ditches! *Why?*

Fast-moving water makes short work of a defoliated bank or ditch, cutting into soil and eroding rapidly. Use only a weed eater, cutting to a *medium height*. Weed eat regularly and gradually grasses, which now have sunlight, will take over from the obnoxious tall weeds that can spring to life and dominate such areas.

*Roundup* and similar products do a wonderful job of weeding. They save work and *properly* used they are a chemical miracle! Restrict use to gravel drives and non-

erosion-prone areas on *private* lots; **NEVER** on *any* green belt property!



#### Septic Tank Systems (STS)

An STS is a way to collect, treat, and dispose of sewage from your lot. It has two primary parts: **The Septic Tank -** It is usually a 1000-gallon plus buried concrete tank (with Green Service Hatches here). It acts like a filter. All water from your drains run into it. In the tank the water sets while solids set-

tle to the bottom (sludge), and grease and oils rise. Anaerobic bacteria break down the sludge and clean the water somewhat. After the water has been in

the tank for a period, new sewage flowing in raises the water level in the tank causing it (now effluent) to flow to the Absorption Field in underground pipe.

The Absorption Field - Most of the clean up is here, as effluent is piped into a labyrinth of special pipe full of holes, in a gravel bed or other approved design. All designs prevent soil from blocking the effluent flow into the soil. Before effluent returns to the soil as plain water, it is cleaned by bacteria, worms, roots, etc. that remove toxins and nutrients. If there is too much sewage flowing into the system, the overloaded Absorption Field will contaminate ground water and sewage may come up in the yard.

**Care and Feeding -** Here are some basics:

- Fix any water drip or leak! Excessive water down the drain hurts the Absorption Field.
- Report soggy areas or black puddles around any Absorption Field in the Campground.
- Don't pour caustic chemicals down the drain. They kill necessary bacteria
- Don't put grease, oil, or ANY trash in a drain; trash can't break down and grease plugs the field.
- Don't use too much water. One hundred gallons per lot per day is our general design limit for water use that flows to inside drains.

## <u>Recipe</u> Self-Filled Cupcakes

1 Box chocolate cake mix 1 Pkg. cream cheese (8 oz.) 1/3 Cup sugar 1 egg Dash salt 1 Cup chocolate chips



Make cake mix following directions on box. Fill paper-lined cupcake pans 2/3 full. Cream cheese and sugar and beat in egg and salt. Stir in chocolate chips. Drop 1 rounded tsp. in each cupcake. Bake as package directs.
