Recipe for the Month: Hoppin' John

1 Tbs. Canola Oil
1 cup Trinity vegetable mix, buy prepared
2 Tbs. cooked bacon pieces
1 (15.5 oz.) can black eyed peas (undrained)
1 cup canned Italian style diced tomatoes (undrained)
1 cup instant rice

Preheat medium saucepan on medium for 2 to 3 minutes. Place oil in pan, swirl to coat. Add trinity mix (diced onions, bell peppers, celery) and cook 3 minutes, stirring often, until vegetables begin to soften. Stir in remaining ingredients (except rice), bring to a boil, stirring occasionally. Stir rice into boiling mixture, cover and remove from heat. Let stand 10 to 20 minutes or until rice is tender. Serve. Eleanor Mazourek, Lot 181 brought this dish to one of the potluck dinners.
