We are also using an excessive amount of water from Well #1 on this side of the bridge. There might be a water leak somewhere in the water system. We would greatly appreciate it if everyone would carefully check their lots and the surrounding areas for any water leaks and get back to me if you find any.

Currently, we are in the process of accepting bids to cut the brush and trim the trees along our roadways and the road outside of the fence area. This should be completed shortly.

A big thanks to the Activities Club for their donation of \$5000.00 for our building fund. The money will be used to improve the parking areas, install handrails, and repair the drop offs along the walkways as well as installing a drainage pipe.

Dehydration

Having suffered from this just this last week, I thought this would be important information to pass on to all of you.

Usually we rely on feeling thirsty to tell us we need to drink water. But seniors, as young as 60, can't depend on the usual signals, because we have a reduced sense of thirst as we age. And the elderly have less water content in their bodies.

Signs and symptoms of dehydration include:

- *Mild to excessive thirst**
- *Fatigue**
- *Headache**
- *Dry mouth**
- *Little or no urination**
- *Muscle weakness**
- *Dizziness**
- *Lightheadedness**
- *Confusion and forgetfulness**
- *Deep rapid breathing or an increased heart rate**

The solutions are easy – drink before you feel thirsty (doctors warn that dehydration can creep up on you). It takes 64 to 80 ounces to replace the water our bodies lose in 24 hours.

Losing as little as 1 to 2% of body weight can result in dehydration. Losing 3 to 5% can negatively impact reaction time, concentration and judgment. Losing 9 to 15% results in severe dehydration and is life-threatening. So drink plenty of fluids and eat foods high in water like fruits.

Remember to take in as much fluid as you're losing each day. As the doctor said, dehydration can creep up on you when least expected.
