Architectural Site and Improvement Committee

Every lot should have (at the very least) signage showing their 911 address (in case of a medical emergency). This is allowed under "Article X" Section 5. "Sign and Billboards", in the PVC covenants.

Please be advised that in case of a "Fire Emergency" the fire department must be able to locate and remove (if necessary) your propane tanks. Our covenants only allow for two (2) 40 pounds tanks. (Article X, Section 2B, item 8).

ALL NEW CONSTRUCTION must have a PVC Building Permit and may require a White County Building Permit. If you have any doubt (whether a PVC Permit is required) please contact an Architectural Committee member. Names, lot numbers and phone numbers will be posted on both bulletin boards. Please refer to "Article X, Section 24. "Lot Structure Improvements".

The question has been asked about storage under the recreation vehicle. Article X, section 13, covers storage under or around the RV. "There shall be no loose storage under the recreational vehicle".

Water & Sewer

Welcome back everyone! For those who arrived in May, you should know we are about to begin our neighborhood valve project. We are doing side one so when work is needed at a particular lot, we don't have to shut off the water to the entire side of the park. The commencement date is 5/26/15 at or about 9:30 am with the water disturbance ending at or around 5pm....in time to prepare dinner. This will continue for several days until the job is complete. Also...the #1 or #2 on the gate is there to inform you which side of the park is being worked on. Side one is the older side at the front of the park and side two is across the creek. You should go to the bulletin board on your side of the park for details about the work being done so you know what to expect. When this job is completed, the entire park will be divided into "neighborhoods" easily turned off for repairs while the rest of the park will enjoy having their water on. I have wanted this for several years and have completed this

project on side two 3 years ago. The problem has been locating water lines on side one. But now we think we have a better understanding of the location of those lines. The difficulty stems from side one being built in several phases and no one producing maps of the system. So we believe we are now ready to complete this important project. With this project, hopefully behind me, my job as water and sewer chairman is done. All "band aids" have been properly repaired and our water and sewer system is in good shape. I am very thankful to all of you for being careful about what you put down your drains and toilets. We had another good inspection report this year. In closing, I want all of you to know how much I'm going to miss being involved as a board member, as this is my final year. My position will end next May1st. But you are in very capable hands with your present board continuing to keep this park in good shape and with a bright and hopeful future.



Recipe of the Month



Layered Pumpkin Streusel Cake

Moist pumpkin cake layered with a brown sugar and walnut streusel Hands On:20 | Total: 80 | Makes: 12 servings (1 slice each)

Ingredients:

PAM® Baking Spray

1 1/2 cups firmly packed light brown sugar

1 cup All Purpose Flour

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

3/4 cup butter or margarine, divided

1 1/2 cups chopped walnuts

1 pkg (18.5 oz each) yellow cake mix (2 layer size)

3 eggs, lightly beaten

1 can (15 oz each) solid pack pumpkin

Confectioners' sugar and Reddiwhip® Original Dairy

Whipped

Topping, optional

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 350°F. Spray 12 cup fluted tube pan with baking spray; set aside. Combine brown sugar, flour and cinnamon in small bowl. Cut in 1/2 cup of the butter with pastry blender or 2 knives until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in walnuts; set aside.
- Beat the remaining 1/4 cup butter and dry cake mix in large bowl with electric mixer on medium speed until light and fluffy. Add eggs, 1 at a time, mixing well after each addition. Add pumpkin; beat 3 minutes, or until well blended.
- Sprinkle 1/3 of the brown sugar mixture onto bottom of prepared pan; cover with 1/3 of the batter, spreading to form even layer in pan. Repeat layers 2 more times.
- Bake 45 minutes, or until wooden pick inserted near center comes out clean. Cool in pan 15 minutes; remove from pan to wire rack. Cool completely. Dust with confectioners' sugar and top with Reddiwhip just before serving, if desired. Cut into 12 slices to serve.
