When bagging leaves please be sure to keep them 2 feet from the road. Also, keep limbs and debris in 4 foot lengths and tied up and again keep them 2 feet from the road. Boxes are to be broken down before placing them in the dumpsters or roll-off.

WATER & SEWER

Welcome back to your beautiful campground!

In the Water and Sewer department this winter was, thankfully, fairly uneventful. We had no emergency situations to tend to. We did finish replacing the 10 lift stations that needed to be updated. The new systems are encapsulated and will not allow ground water to invade and be pumped to the drain fields. Many thanks to North Georgia Environmental for their exceptional work and helping us to stay under budget. The water systems on side one and side two have been operating smoothly. I flushed both systems the second week of March so we could start the season with fresh water. American Water continues to do weekly maintenance on both systems. I have renumbered all the lift stations and septic tanks throughout the park to have a more logical system. Little signs, like the ones marking our water valves, will soon be planted at each lift station and septic tank to make them easier to find and identify.

Finally, since this is my last message as head of water and sewer, I thank all of you for allowing me the privilege of working for PVC. Also, I want to thank all Board members for their hard work and dedication to making this an exceptional campground!

Recipe of the Month

"A delicious, classic chicken dish -- lightly coated chicken breasts braised with Marsala wine and mushrooms. Easy and ideal for both a quick weeknight entree AND serving to company."



Chicken Marsala

Prep 10 m, Cook 20 m, Ready In 30 m

Ingredients:

1/4 cup all-purpose flour for coating
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves - pounded
1/4 inch thick
4 tablespoons butter
4 tablespoons olive oil
1 cup sliced mushrooms
1/2 cup Marsala wine
1/4 cup cooking sherry

Directions:

In a shallow dish or bowl, mix together the flour, salt, pepper and oregano. Coat chicken pieces in flour mixture.

In a large skillet, melt butter in oil over medium heat. Place chicken in the pan, and lightly brown. Turn over chicken pieces, and add mushrooms. Pour in wine and sherry. Cover skillet; simmer chicken 10 minutes, turning once, until no longer pink and juices run clear. Serve over wide egg noodles and a side salad or veggie.

Warm Blackberry Sauce Over Mango Sorbet

PREP TIME 10 mins COOK TIME 5 mins YIELD Makes 6 servings

Ingredients

2 pt. fresh blackberries, halved 1/4 cup sugar 2 1/2 teaspoons orange zest 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger 1/4 -1/2 cup of Pomegranate Juice 1 pt Mango Sorbet Serve with these awesome: Almond-Oat Lace Cookies Recipe on following page

How to Make It

Stir together first 5 ingredients in a saucepan over medium heat; cook, stirring constantly, 5 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Serve over sorbet; sprinkle with gingersnaps.

Note: For testing purposes only, we used Häagen-Dazs Mango Sorbet. I use Talenti sorbet.



Almond-Oat Lace Cookies MAKES ABOUT 24 SERVINGS

Ingredients:

MAKES ABOUT 24 SERVINGS

1/2 cup whole natural unsalted almonds with skins
2 tablespoons old-fashioned oats
6 tablespoons (3/4 stick) unsalted butter
6 tablespoons superfine sugar
2 tablespoons (packed) light brown sugar
1 1/2 teaspoons honey
1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
4 ounces' bittersweet chocolate, melted

Preparation:

Arrange racks in lower and upper thirds of oven; preheat to 350°. Line 2 rimless baking sheets with parchment paper. Pulse almonds and oats in a food processor until coarse meal forms. Set aside.

Melt butter in a medium saucepan over medium heat. Add both sugars and honey; whisk until blended and sugar dissolves, 1-2 minutes. Remove from heat. Add nut mixture, flour, and salt; stir until well blended. Spoon batter by 2-teaspoon portions onto baking sheets, spacing 2 1/2" apart. Using your fingertips, pat cookies down to 1/4"-high rounds; push in any jagged edges to form smooth circles. Bake, rotating sheets after 6 minutes, until dark golden brown and cookies spread out into a thin layer, 10--12 minutes. Slide cookies on parchment onto a wire rack and let cool. Using a pastry brush, brush half of each cookie with melted chocolate. Let stand until the chocolate is set, about 2 hours. DO AHEAD: Can be made 2 days ahead. Store airtight in between sheets of parchment or waxed paper.

- Prior to beginning any construction or major improvements to your property, contact must be made with the Architectural Committee. If you are in doubt as to whether a permit is required, please contact a member of the Architectural Committee.
- The Grounds Committee would like to remind you that this is the time of year to begin clean-up of your property. The Board will begin checking for lot violations regarding clean up on May 15th. Please make arrangements to have your property cleaned.
- The dumpsters are for **Household Waste Only**. Please remember to break down all boxes that are placed in the dumpsters.
- Items other than household waste; chairs, tables, small appliances, flower pots, etc. need to be taken to the **Roll Off Dumpster** located down by the trailer storage area. These items are not to be placed in or around the garbage dumpsters. There is no need to ask for a key to the gate as the gate is unlocked.
- Please be very mindful of what you put into the septic system. Please do not pour grease of **ANY** kind into the system. Wipes of any kind and Feminine products should not be flushed down the toilets.
- Please turn your water off at the main valve on your lot when leaving the Campground for more than 48 hours. This will prevent or limit damage to your lot, RV, Park Model, Cabin and protect the overall water system.
- Pets Those of us who have them know only too well how special they are to us. But not everyone feels the same way, so PLEASE be considerate to all! No pets are allowed in the pool area or the pavilion. Be sure to carry plastic bags when walking your dogs to clean up after them. No dog enclosures, whether temporary or permanent, are allowed to be put up in the park.
- No blowing leaves in the ditches, green spaces, or creek. It is necessary for everyone to help with keeping these areas clean of debris.

We thank you in advance for your cooperation in these matters. Your attention to these matters will enhance our Campground and help to reduce maintenance costs for all of us.

Together we can all make a difference.
