FROM THE WATER & SEWER COMMITTEE:


Please remember to drain your hot water heater and turn off your water at the main valve when you leave for the winter.

Thanks to all who have donated utensils, etc. for use in the kitchen and pavilion.




POTLUCK BRUNCH RECIPE OF THE MONTH:

Country Apple and Sausage Oven Pancake

INGREDIENTS:

1 medium cooking apple, thinly sliced.

1/2 cup packed brown sugar
1/3 cup butter
1/2 cup maple-flavored syrup
1 pound bulk pork sausage
1 cup Original Bisquick
1/4 cup packed brown sugar
1/2 cup milk
1 egg



DIRECTIONS:

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Spread apple slices evenly over bottom of ungreased rectangular pan, 13x9x2 inches. Heat ½ cup brown sugar, butter and syrup in a 1-quart saucepan over low heat, stirring occasionally, until melted. Pour syrup mixture over apples.

Cook sausage in 10-inch skillet over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until no longer pink; drain. Sprinkle sausage evenly over apple-syrup mixture. Stir remaining ingredients until blended. Carefully pour over sausage.

Bake uncovered 30 to 35 minutes or until top springs back when touched in center. Cut into 3-inch squares; turn each square upside down onto plate. Serve immediately with additional syrup if desired. (Prepared by Donna Winburn-Lot 266)

POTLUCK RECIPE OF THE MONTH:

Polish Sausage

INGREDIENTS:

- lb sausage (links)
- bottle chili sauce
- ½ box brown sugar

DIRECTIONS:

Bake sausage for 25 minutes @ 350 degrees. Cut into bite size pieces.

Mix chili sauce and brown sugar together.

Pour into crockpot, add sausage and simmer for 2-3 hours.
