Water and Sewer happenings have been relatively quiet lately. North Georgia Environmental covered



the park conducting sludge tests on our septic tanks to determine if any of them need to be pumped out. I have not yet received their report but expect it soon. We have replaced a couple of main cut off valves to individual lots keeping the water shut off times to a minimum. The booster pump which was to be reinstalled in well house two after being rebuilt was tested a final time before being reinstalled. It failed and was determined to be useless. American Water will be getting us pricing for a new pump. New maps of our water system line, with explanations, have been supplied to us in digital form. Work needs to be done to add the septic tank and lift station locations to the maps. We will get this done and supply new maps for the park. One more friendly reminder - if you plan to be leaving the park soon for the end of season, now is a good time to check your main cut off valve to make sure it is working properly. Too many times owners try to turn off their valves only to have the handle break off in their hand. Enjoy your fall season!

Looking for brilliant leaf colors in **north Georgia?** The week of Oct. 26 looks good for a trip into the great outdoors, while the week of Nov. 2 is optimum **leaf**-color time for the rest of the state.





Creamy Pumpkin Pasta with Pine Nut Gremolata

- 🕴 12 oz Rigatoni
- 2 tbsp Olive Oil, divided
- 12 Fresh Sage Leaves
- ¹ ¼ C Pine Nuts, toasted and roughly chopped
- 1 tsp finely grated Lemon Zest
- 1 Shallot, finely chopped
- 2 Cloves Garlic, pressed
- Kosher Salt and freshly ground Black pepper
- 🕴 1 c Canned Pure Pumpkin
- 2 oz Parmesan Cheese, grated (about ½ cup) plus a little more for serving
- 1/3 c Heavy Cream
- 1/8 tsp Fresh grated Nutmeg

DIRECTIONS

1. Cook pasta per package directions. Reserve 1 cup cooking water; drain pasta and return to pot. 2. Heat 1 tablespoon oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add sage and cook until crisp, 2 to 3 minutes. Transfer with a slotted spoon to a paper towel-lined plate; when cool, crumble into pieces. Toss together sage, pine nuts, and lemon zest in a bowl. 3. Add remaining 1 tablespoon oil, shallot, and garlic to saucepan. Season with salt and pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally, until tender, 1 to 2 minutes. Add pumpkin, Parmesan, heavy cream, nutmeg, and 1/2 cup reserved pasta water. Cook until slightly thickened, 3 to 5 minutes. Season with salt. (If desired, use an immersion blender or standard blender to puree until smooth.) Add pasta and stir to combine (add more pasta water if sauce seems too thick). Serve sprinkled with Pine Nut Gremolata.
