Recipe

Mexican Chicken Casserole

- 1 Whole chicken, cooked, boned & chopped (About 4 cups)
- 1 (11 1/2 oz.) pkg. flour tortillas
- 2 Cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 (10 3/4 oz.) can Cream of Chicken Soup
- 1 (10 3/4 oz.) can Cheddar Cheese Soup
- 1 (10 3/4 oz.) can Cream of Mushroom Soup
- 2 (10 oz.) can Ro-tel tomatoes

In a large bowl, stir together the three kinds of soup and the tomatoes. Stir in the chicken. In a greased 13 X 9 inch pan or baking dish, layer the tortillas and the chicken mixture, beginning and ending with tortillas. Sprinkle the cheese over the casserole and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.
