Welcome to our new 2019 season! The Architecture Committees job is to help keep our campground beautiful. We help

everyone follow the Covenants when improving their property. It is a very rewarding committee. We also need volunteers for the coming season. Just let me know if you are interested. Also, as you clean your site and prepare for the 2019 season, please keep in mind you need a permit from the county on items such as decks, cabins, 8X10 storage buildings etc. We do not represent or work for the county, except they come out here and drive around and if they see something that they say needs a county permit and they discover you did not get a permit from them, they can have you remove what you built. So, to forestall this, I will be unable to issue a PVC permit unless you get a county permit or a waiver or a statement that you do not need their permit. We need two members of the committee to visit your lot prior to issuing you a permit. A park permit is good for 30 days, so if your material is not coming for 2 weeks let us know up front and we can act accordingly.

WHAT'S COOK'N' ??

EASY RAVIOLI BAKE RECIPE

Ingredients:

- ♦ 1 (24 oz bag) frozen ravioli
- ♦ 1 (24 oz jar) marinara sauce
- ◊ 2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1/3 cup Parmesan cheese for sprinkling



- 1. Preheat oven to 400° and grease 9 x 13" baking dish
- 2. Spread about 3/4 cup of marinara into the bottom of baking dish
- **3.** Arrange half of the frozen ravioli in a single layer over the marinara sauce
- 4. Top with half of the remaining sauce and half of the mozzarella cheese
- 5. Repeat the layers with what is left of frozen ravioli, marinara remainder of sauce and mozzarella, sprinkle with Parmesan if you would like
- Cover the baking dish with aluminum foil and bake for 30 minutes, remove foil and continue baking for 15 minutes or until cheese is bubbly and starting to brown
- 7. Let it cool for 5-10 minutes and then serve alone or with garlic bread and a salad

Recipe Notes: Try mixing with ravioli stuffed with beef, chicken or spinach. Try using alfredo sauce rather than marinara sauce.

VISIT CLEVELAND



Cleveland's town square features a historic courthouseturned-museum dating back to the 1800s. The shops on the square include Nix Hardware, with everything from appliances and furniture to Meaders Pottery. The historic Merchant's Square building features Bella's Boutique, and Rush Ewin provides an eclectic shopping experience. Stop by the Old Fashioned Soda Fountain Cafe for freshly squeezed lemonade and other delightful treats. Smokey Mountain Trader is the largest Carhart dealer in the North Georgia mountains specializing in outdoor recreation equipment.

Nearby activities include fly fishing, gold panning, golfing, hiking to numerous waterfalls, mountain biking, repelling and paddling on the famous Chattahoochee River. White County is home to the Unicoi Wine Trail, featuring five wineries and nine tasting rooms. And, did you know Cleveland is home of the Original Cabbage Patch Kids and Babyland General Hospital? Don't miss a little Bavaria in Helen!

Waterfalls Worthy of a Walk in the Woods

The beauty of Georgia's waterfalls can lure even the not – so-outdoorsy types off the beaten path and into picture-perfect wilds.

- 1. Amicalola Falls State Park & Falls
 - *418 Amicalola Falls Rd., Dawsonville
 - * Daily Park Pass \$5.00/car 7am-10pm

The tallest cascading waterfall in the Southeast. You can choose the accessible pathway or a challenging trail with staircase to view the tumbling waters.

- 2. DeSoto Falls Recreation Area
 - * US 129/19N, Dahlonega

Hike along the two mile DeSoto Falls Trail or fish for trout in Frogtown Creek.

- 3. Helton Creek Falls
 - * US Hwy 129 S, Blairsville

Helton Creek Falls Trail (.3 mile) follows Helton Creek to two waterfalls. The trail accesses the lower falls at both the bottom and top of the falls and ends at the bottom of the upper falls. The total vertical drop is more than 100

- feet. Slipper rocks around the falls, exercise caution.
- 4. Raven Cliff Falls—CNF
 - * Off Hwy 348, Helen

Located in the Chattooga Ranger District, this waterfall is perhaps one of the most unusual in north GA because the water flows through a spilt in the face of a solid rock outcropping to the ground 100 feet below. Behind the split, the water drops approximately 60 feet and then rushes through the rock face and drops 20 feet into a deep pool. The water then cascades 20 more feet to Dodd Creek where there are three other waterfalls found along the creek.

5. Anna Ruby Falls and Recreation Area



* 16 and older: \$3.00/Under 16 free

* 3455 Anna Ruby Falls Rd., Helen

Twin waterfalls from Curtis Creek (150 feet) and York Creek (50 feet) merge to form Smith Creek. These falls are reached by a scenic half-mile interpretive trail that parallels Smith Creek and ends at the base of the falls. The 0.15 mile Lion's Eye interpretive trail near the visitor center and craft shop is available for persons with visual and/ or physical disabilities. One of the most visited waterfalls in North Georgia.

On the following pages, is a list of GENERAL PARK INFORMATION. The decision was made to post these

every month for you and new members to refer to. So keep them on your refrigerator for future reference.

RIGHT-OF-WAY: Motor vehicles and RVs have the RIGHT-OF-WAY over golf carts. It's much easier for a golf cart to move off the narrow roads than a larger

vehicle!

GARBAGE:



The **Dumpsters** (by the mailboxes) are for Household Waste Only. Break down all boxes flat that are to be placed in the dumpsters. Garbage pickup is Tuesdays and Fridays.

Items other than household waste; chairs, tables, small appliances, flower pots, old wood, etc. need to be taken to the **Roll Off** dumpster located down by the trailer storage area. If the gate is locked, this means the roll-off is full. Please do not leave items around the roll-off or at the gate. Hold on to them, check with Darrell (Grounds) to find out when it will be emptied, and place it in the roll-off at that time.



Be aware of where you put your garbage bags! People have put them on top of their cars and driven away and forgotten them, only to have them fall off over the park roads or on Paradise Valley Road.

Items have been found in the roll-off that are in perfect condition. The Community Thrift Store is located on 1160 E Kytle St (Rte. 115) in Cleveland, and they accept most things in good condition and they donate some of the profits to local charities. Give them a call if you have any questions tel: 706-865-0574 and PLEASE... do not leave items outside the roll-off. Can't get your item into the roll-off? Ask for help!!

WATER CODES: Have you noticed the numbers and letters on the gate and have no idea what these mean? Paradise has a code system in the park for water and sewer issues. The explanation to this is: the number "1" represents side one in the park. This encompasses lots 1 through 194, which are all on the entrance side of the park. The number "2" represents side two of the park. Which encompasses lots 195 thru 290, which are all the lots over the bridge. The letter "B" represents that a "Boil Notice" is in effect. This means, if posted on the gate, that all lots affected by a water problem must boil their water prior to use. Notices are posted by the mailboxes, on the bridge board and at the laundry room. Also, an e-Blast with this information is sent out to all residents who are registered on the PVCOA.com website. If you have not registered on the website, you will NOT receive this information via your email.



CONSERVING PARK EXPENSES:

Please remember to turn off the lights in the pavilion, rest rooms, laundry, and to close down the umbrellas at the pool and put them in the ladies' and men's room. This will extend their life for fu-

ture years. Straighten chairs in the pavilion, breezeway, pool...in other words treat the park like you would your own home, because it is! Remember, the expenses incurred to repair, replace or fix these issues come from your pocket!

GEORGIA DNR (Department of Natural Resources):



prohibits any and all changes made to the creeks and streams. Trees or vegetation cannot be removed from the side of the creek. Clearing can only be done up to the top of the bank. This means that moving rocks or natural vegetation and dump-

ing debris of any kind into the waterways are illegal. Please be aware the county has in the past issued fines for these violations.

The outdoor shower at the pool is to be used for washing off suntan lotion and/or anti-perspiration prior to entering the pool, NOT to cleanse your body....that should be done at your cabin/RV!

Please note Georgia state regulations have changed and are posted up at the pool. Please read and follow these rules for the safety of all. Also, please for

everyone's safety "No Diving" is permitted a the pool.

HAVE A DELIVERY?



Waiting for a package to arrive and have no idea where it will be delivered? Check the sales office (the building on the right side at the entrance with the mailbox in front). It was formerly the real-estate sales office. It is now where packages are delivered from UPS and FedEx. So, stop in periodically to see if your package arrived safely. One important thing...please check the label to be sure the package belongs to you. Other members' packages

are being picked up in error, thinking they have the correct one.



AMERICAN FLAGS are to be burned in ceremony! Don't know how? Hang on to them, ask a board member

what procedure to follow. Perhaps they can be collected and burned in a ceremony at one time!



Roger is not the campground manager, he is our work camper. His responsibilities come from a member of the board, NOT an individual

owner in the park! If you have an issue or suggestion that needs attention, please contact a board member and they will handle the issue.

BOOK & MOVIE DONATIONS:

Anyone who has been to the laundry has seen the numerous books, games and tapes/CDs



surround the walls. All these items have been generously donated by members of PVC. They are there to borrow and return afterwards for others to appreciate. Please feel free to donate the above items for others to continue to enjoy throughout the years!



WATER SHUT OFF: When leaving the Campground for more than 48 hours, it is imperative to shut your water off at the main valve in order to prevent damage to your

property and to protect the overall water system in the campground.



SEPTIC:

Please be very mindful of what you put into the septic system. It is important that you remember not to pour grease down your

drains. Feminine products, wipes, non-biodegradable waste should not be flushed down the toilets. This has caused MA-JOR problems in the past that resulted in expensive repairs.



PETS: Those of us who have them know only too well how special they are to us. But not everyone feels the same way, so PLEASE be

considerate to all! No pets are allowed in the pool area or the pavilion. Be sure to carry plastic bags when walking your dog to clean up after them. No dog enclosures, whether temporary or permanent, are allowed to be put up in the park.



MOTORCYCLES are not permitted to ride around the park like a golf cart. They are only allowed egress and ingress. Please comply with this rule.

911 EMERGENCY CALLS:

When calling 911 from a cell phone, you must specify <u>White</u> <u>County</u>! If you don't, you could



lose much-needed minutes as your call will go to Lumpkin or Habersham County, and they transfer your information to White County. Be safe and remember, White County! When at the pool or pavilion, please note there is a phone outside the laundry room door for emergency use.





WI FI SERVICE: For those of you who do not have Internet access available at your cab-

in or trailer, it is available to you. Come, relax and get your emails at the pavilion. Sign into free Internet service. The code and password are as follows:

WI FI Network: Win_5d4e, WI FI Password: z9huuksg.



QUIET TIME: Quiet time is 11 p.m. to 8 a.m. Using motorized equipment or creating loud noises is prohibited between these hours.



POST OFFICE: If you do not have a mailbox, your mail cannot be left at the PVC mailbox area. Arrangements must be made with the Cleveland Post Office to manage the han-

dling of your mail.



DO NOT Let anyone through the gate who you don't know!! It's for everyone's safety!!

Board Members

The board members are volunteers who devote their time and effort to keeping PVC what it is..."the best RV park in Cleveland." Please be mindful of this when you get upset that something is not being taken care of, i.e. American flags being put in the dumpster, the blueberry bushes and common grounds not being maintained, dog droppings not being picked up. REMEMBER...this is YOUR park, too. It's up to ALL owners to do their part so this park is maintained.

So PLEASE, if you see something happening that isn't right, say something, in a nice way. Some people may not realize or know the rules. Take part and act, not complain. BOD hours are 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday - Friday, unless the owner is a weekender. Be considerate, call before going to their lot! They're here to enjoy Paradise also!
