As stated in last month's issue, White Co. celebrates 150 years! So again, here is some history about our county.

Did you know that there was once a movie theatre in Cleveland, named the Princess Theatre? It was built about 1947 or 48. Attached to it was the Princess Grill which had a pool room in the back. Tickets in 1951 sold for ten cents each. These buildings were located on the northwest side of the square. Now the Mountain Trader occupies the building where the theatre was and a business occupies the grill. The most probable cause of the theatre closing was the coming of the drive-in theatre.

## **RECIPE FOR THE MONTH**

**Clams Over Linguini** 

2 (6oz.) cans minced clams, don't drain
1 large onion
1/3 cup olive oil
1 Tbsp. butter
1 Tbsp. dried basil
2-3 cloves garlic minced
1 Tbsp. parsley flakes
1 lb. package linguini

#### In a large skillet:

Sauté onion and minced garlic in oil and butter until onions are soft. Add basil, parsley and undrained clams. Simmer 10 to 15 minutes. Cook linguini according to package directions. Drain linguini, put it into a serving dish, pour clam sauce over hot linguini and serve.

Optional: Sprinkle parmesan cheese and/or red pepper flakes over linguini.

This is a quick, easy, delicious dish. Enjoy!
