RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Stuffed Cornish Hens

1 pkg. long-grain and wild rice mix, 6 oz.
¹/₂ cup chopped celery
1 can (4 oz.) chopped mushrooms, drained
1/4 cup melted butter
1 tbsp. Soy sauce
4 Cornish game hens, approx. 1 lb. each

Cook rice according to package directions; cool. Add celery, chopped mushrooms, butter, and soy sauce; toss lightly to mix. Stuff hens; place in roasting pan. Roast loosely covered at 375 degrees for 30 minutes. Remove cover and continue roasting hens for about 60 minutes or until done. Baste hens with butter during last 30 minutes, if desired.
