They ask you to remove the cap from the plastic container, and rinse cans if possible.

**Recipes**: We had one of our tastiest Pot Luck dinners in June. Everyone wanted everyone else's recipes! To that end, 3 recipes have been turned in thus far. Please get more recipes to us and we will print them. Thanks for being good cooks and sharing...

#### Pineapple Casserole by Paula Deen Made by: June Brangham (8 servings)

- 1 cup sugar
- 6 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 cups grated sharp cheddar
- 2 (20-ounce) cans pineapple chunks, drained, and 6 tablespoons juice reserved
- 1 cup Ritz cracker crumbs
- 1 stick butter, melted, plus extra fro greasing pan

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a medium size dish with butter. In a large bowl, stir together the sugar and flour. Gradually stir in the cheese. Add the pineapple chunks, and stir until ingredients are well combined. Pour the mixture into the casserole dish. In another medium bowl, combine the cracker crumbs, melted butter, and reserved pineapple juice, stirring with a rubber spatula until blended. Spread crumb mixture on top of pineapple mixture. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until golden brown.

#### Cheese Cake - No Bake, Jello Made by: Gail Flynn

Cinnamon crisp graham crackers 1 stick butter 1 package lemon Jell-o 1 lg & 1 sm cream cheese (20 oz) 1 cup granulated sugar 1 large can evaporated milk, chilled 1 cup crushed pineapple, drained and pressed dry

Crush 2 of the 3 packages of crackers in the box using a zip lock bag. Mix 1 stick of melted butter with crumbs. Line the bottom of a  $11 \times 13$  pan with crumbs and set in fridge to cool. Reserve about one half cup to sprinkle on top later.

Filling: Dissolve jell-o in 1 cup boiling water. Allow to cool till the consistency of egg white. (Be careful not to get too hard.) Cream sugar & cream cheese together. Whip chilled milk until stiff. Cream jell-o into cheese mixture. Mix stiffened milk into mixture. Add pineapple. Pour into crumb lined pan and allow to cool in fridge. Sprinkle with crumbs if preferred.

Taco Salad Made by: Eleanor Mazourek

- 1# Hamburger (fry & cool)
- 1 head of lettuce
- 1/2 bag corn chips (crunch up)
- 1 tomatao diced
- 1 small onion diced
- 12 oz sharp chedddar cheeese (shredded)
- 8 oz Creamy Italian dressing

Mix corn chips and Italian dressing in salad just before serving
