## **White County Animal Control**

Although there is no Leash Law in White County, there is a NUISANCE LAW. We have had a honey colored Husky/Malamute dog of considerable size, roaming our community for quite awhile. Recently, it was inside the fenced pool area. He has been removed 4 times, but kept getting back in, as he could fit through some of the slats in the fencing. This might jeopardize our Pool Permit. A resident contacted Animal Control, to explain that the dog is harmless, very friendly, but has been creating problems. Some children have been afraid of the dog due to its size and many of our PVC dog owners are concerned. He roams through the woods and likely could be carrying

fleas and ticks. The resident contacted the owner, Will Nix at (404) 939-4556, and was told there was no leash law, just shoo him away. Thus the call to Animal Control. Animal Control has contacted Mr. Nix advising him of the Nuisance Law. If they receive further complaints, they will start fining Mr. Nix.



No Yard of the Month for 2011


Due to a lack of volunteer judges, yard of the month is cancelled for this year, but many of the yards are beautiful!
