Wow it doesn't seem possible that this season is approaching the halfway mark. We've accomplished a lot this year and have some very exciting things still ahead. Five open positions must be filled for the 2020 BOD and we have 5 nominees who have accepted the challenge. Your slate this year is Karen Cantrell, Joe Cuce, John Maske, Carole Winter, and Jim Zilaro. In order to get to know everyone a bit better, candidate Bios are included in this

Pipeline. A big thank-you goes out to the Nominating committee chaired by Teresa Rogers and ably assisted by Committee members Lynn Harris and Judy Stewart. A meet the candidates session is planned to directly follow the July 13th BOD meeting to provide additional opportunities to get to know your candidates. Ballots will be mailed to all owners in good standing at the end of July with the same process that was implemented and worked so well last year. Instructions for the completion and return of the ballots will be included in the mailing. Double sided envelopes will be utilized with owners' signatures required on the back side of the envelope. Ballots are to be returned by the August 31st deadline to meet the By-law requirements of the Saturday before Labor Day election. Hand delivered Ballots will also be accepted on that Saturday the 31st between 9-10 a.m. All ballots will be unopened and secured in a Ballot Box until that morning. The ballots will be counted by a specially designated team and the official pronouncement of the elected members will be announced at approximately 2pm that Saturday. The new board will confirm the 2020 President who will then appoint the Board members to their positions to go into effect April 1, 2020. The newly elected representatives will serve a 2-year position except for the candidate with the least votes who will serve for a single year. More exciting news! In addition to the ballots, static cling stickers for your vehicle windshield will be included in the mailing. These stickers will assist in identifying owners' vehicles from non-owners and reinforce security in the Park. We are requesting the stickers be placed on the lower front driver's side windshield. This will allow for easy visual identification and enable owners to decide who should be allowed entry when vehicles are parked or waiting at the gate.

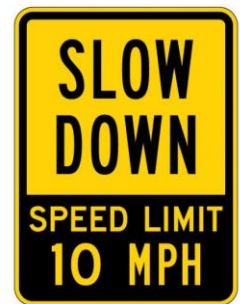
Architectural – John Maske

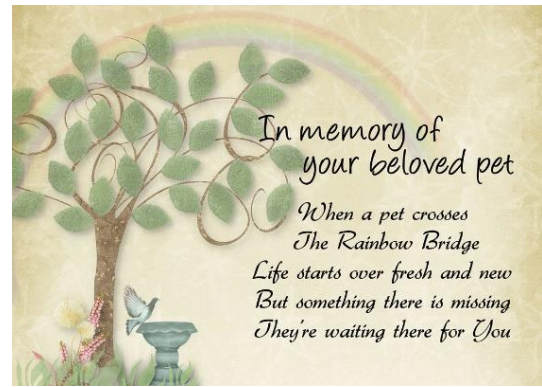

## WHAT'S COOK'N'?

### Blueberry-Cinnamon Campfire Bread



## INGREDIENTS

- 1 loaf (1 pound) cinnamon-raisin bread
- 6 large eggs
- 1 cup 2% milk or half-and-half cream
- 2 tablespoons maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans, toasted
- 2 cups fresh blueberries, divided

## DIRECTIONS

- Prepare campfire or grill for low heat. Arrange bread slices on a greased double thickness of heavy-duty foil (about 24x18 in.). Bring foil up the sides, leaving the top open. Whisk eggs, milk, syrup and vanilla. Pour over bread; sprinkle with nuts and 1 cup blueberries. Fold edges over top, crimping to seal.
- Place on a grill grate over campfire or grill until eggs are cooked through, 30-40 minutes. Remove from heat; let stand 10 minutes. Sprinkle with remaining blueberries; serve with additional maple syrup if desired.

**Oven Directions:** Preheat oven to 350°. Place foil packet on a 15x10x1-in. baking pan. Bake 25-30 minutes or until heated through? Let stand 10 minutes before serving. Sprinkle with remaining blueberries; serve with syrup.

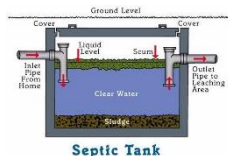
## Did you know?



### Have a Delivery?

Waiting for a package to arrive and have no idea where it will be delivered? Check the sales office (the building on the right side at the entrance). It was formerly the real estate sales office. This area is now used for packages being delivered from UPS and FED EX. So, stop in periodically to see if your packages arrived safely. One important thing...please be sure to check the address label to ensure you are grabbing the right package. At times other members' packages have been picked up in error.

**Water Shut Off:** When leaving the Campground for more than 48 hours it is imperative to shut your water off at the main valve in order to prevent damage to your property and to protect the overall water system in our campground.



**Septic:** Please be very mindful of what you put into the septic system. It is important that you remember not to pour grease down your drains.

Feminine products, wipes and non-biodegradable waste is not flushed down the toilets. This has caused MAJOR problems in the past that have resulted in expensive repairs.

**Post Office:** If you do not have a mailbox, your mail can not be left at the PVC mailbox area. Arrangements must be made with the Cleveland Post Office to manage the handling of your mail.



**Board Members:** The board members are volunteers who devote their time and effort to keeping PVC what it is... "the BEST RV Park in Cleveland". Please be mindful of this when you get upset that something does not appear to be taken care of, i.e. roll off full, the blueberry bushes and common areas not maintained, dog droppings not being picked up, etc. Remember, this is also your park and it is up to all owners to help maintain the park. If you see something that you believe is not right say something, in a nice way! Some people may not realize or know all the rules. BOD Hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday – Friday unless the owner is a weekender. Be considerate and call before going to their lot. Remember they are also here to enjoy Paradise!

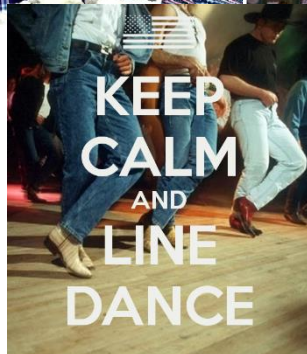
### CAUGHT IN THE ACT!
