# **REMINDERS**

# **RECIPE FOR THE MONTH**

**Baked Macaroni and Cheese** 

8 ounces macaroni

3 quarts boiling water

3 teaspoons salt

2 tablespoons margarine

2 tablespoons flour

2 cups milk

1 egg beaten

½ pound sharp cheese, grated

Cook macaroni until tender and drain then rinse with hot water. Melt margarine, blend in flour, and add mild and egg. Stir sauce until it thickens. Add cheese and stir until melted. Arrange macaroni and cheese sauce in layers in a buttered casserole dish. Bake at 400 degrees for about 15 minutes.
