RECIPE OF THE MONTH:



Fluffy French Toast

Prep 10 m, Cook 20 m, Ready In 30 m *Recipe By:* Bonnie

"This French toast recipe is different because it uses flour. I have given it to some friends and they've all liked it better than the French toast they usually make!"

Ingredients

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1 cup milk

1 pinch salt

3 eggs

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 tablespoon white sugar

12 thick slices bread

Directions

- 1. Measure flour into a large mixing bowl. Slowly whisk in the milk. Whisk in the salt, eggs, cinnamon, vanilla extract and sugar until smooth.
- 2. Heat a lightly oiled griddle or frying pan over medium heat. Soak bread slices in mixture until saturated. Cook bread on each side until golden brown. Serve hot with butter and syrup or with a bowl of fresh strawberries, raspberries, blueberries, blackberries, bananas and whipped cream.
