RECIPE

Buck's BBQ Rub

1/3 part Lowery Season Salt1/3 part Brown Sugar (thin grain in jar)1/3 part Hot Cayenne Pepper (2 t more if you like it hotter)Kosher Salt to taste

Rub on Boston Butts or Ribs.

Put meat in heavy duty tin foil. Pour Apple Juice over the meat. Fold



over the tin foil double tight. Put grill on and cook to 250 degrees using thermometer. lf meat toosalty, add more brown sugar. After meat is done, add BBQ sauce and let meat stay on grill 3-5 minutes longer.

A variation on this for *RIBS* is to use molasses instead of Apple Juice and follow the other recipe as indicated. Buck Tidwell Lot #16
