Architectural continued:

The Architectural Committee is guided by PVC's covenants. Our covenants are in place to protect the integrity of our Park. Many of us think that the covenants need to be updated. Unfortunately, in the last two (2) tries, covenants changes failed by a slim margin. Until they are changed we MUST be guided by our present covenants. The big issue that the "Committee" has had over the past four (4) years, is owners doing exterior work without a PVC permit (when required). This is in direct violation of our "Covenants". In the future if you are planning on making architectural improvements please check with Jerry Coleman (our new Architectural Chairperson) and his committee to see if a PVC permit will be required.

It has been my pleasure to serve with board members who always had the best interest of PVC at heart. We had a lot of conservation concerning all issues concerning PVC (and at the end of the day) and felt we made the right decision to resolve the issue. Even when we made the wrong decision we worked very quickly to correct that mistake.

Looking to the future, PVC will need strong leadership to keep our park great. Please consider running for the Board of Directors, you will find it very rewarding to be part of the group that will keep PVC strong and moving forward.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH:

Here's some different recipes that you may be interested in:

Weed Killer:

1 gal of White Vinegar2 Cups Epson Salts1/2 cup Blue Dawn Dish Detergent

Put in a Spray Bottle and apply to weeds

Window Cleaner:

1/2 Gal Warm Water1 Tbsp. Liquid Jet Dry2 to 3 Tbsp. of Blue Dawn Dish detergent

Mix Above. Spray windows with hose, wipe or brush on solution & immediately hose it off with water. It will sheet off & you won't have to wipe the windows dry!
