

COLD DRINKS

If you would like to purchase one they are .50/each. Drop your money in the box at the fridge!



Bagged ice is available at the pavilion breezeway in the freezer. This is also purchased via the honor system, please leave your money in the container at the freezer. Cost for ice is \$3.00/bag.

Please remember to turn off the lights in the pavilion, rest rooms, and laundry and to close the umbrellas at the pool and put them in the ladies' and men's room. This will extend their life for

Be sure to take in your bird feeders at night and ensure all food is picked up and inside. Black bears are very opportunistic eaters, mostly eating grasses, roots, berries, fish, and insects (and

YUM YUM RECIPE!

Southern Shrimp and Grits

Traditional low country shrimp and grits prepared the Southern way, with shrimp, bacon and andouille sausage in a Cajun spiced sauce served over creamy, cheesy grits. Southern comfort food at its finest Here's what you'll need:

- *Shrimp use* the tails to make a quick stock with water while the grits cook.
 - Bacon and Andouille Sausage

- Onion, garlic, and parsley
- Cajun seasoning and smoked paprika
- A little *white wine* and easy to make *shrimp stock* for the sauce.
- Fresh lemon juice, Worcestershire sauce and butter to finish off the pan sauce.
- Yellow cornmeal white cornmeal is traditional, stone-ground is preferred.
- Homemade chicken stock to cook the grits in with some garlic. Store bought low sodium chicken stock will work, but homemade is best if you have it.
- *Parmesan, sour cream and butter to* finish off the grits and make them extra creamy and delicious!

Step 1: Make your shrimp stock, place shells in water and simmer until reduced by about half. Start this while the grits are cooking.

Step 2: Make the grits. Stir the corn grits into simmering chicken stock and cook and stir until thickened. Add the cheese, sour cream and butter and combine until thick and creamy. Cut heat and cover while you prepare the shrimp.

Step 3: Brown the sausage, remove and set aside. Crisp the bacon and render the fat, remove and set aside with the sausage. Cook the onions in bacon fat until translucent and starting to brown, add the garlic.

Step 4: Add the shrimp and seasonings and cook a few minutes until the shrimp is just cooked through.
Step 5: Deglaze the pan with the wine and shrimp stock, simmer until reduced by about half.
Step 6: Stir in the Worcestershire and lemon juice.
Step 7: Add the sausage and bacon back to the pan and combine to heat through. Swirl in a pat of butter, taste for salt and pepper. Spoon over grits, sprinkle with parsley and serve immediately.
