Banana Split Dessert

2 cups vanilla wafer crumbs 1/2 stick butter, melted 4 bananas, sliced over crust 1 (14 oz.) can sweetened condensed milk 1/4 cup lemon juice 1 (20 oz.) can crushed pineapple, well drained 1 (12 oz.) tub frozen whipped topping

1 cup nuts, chopped 1 cup coconut

Mix crumbs and butter for crust. Press into 9 X 13 " dish. Slice bananas over crust. Mix condensed milk and lemon juice. Spread over bananas. Place pineapple over milk mixture. Put whipped topping over pineapple. Sprinkle nuts and coconut over shipped topping. Refrigerate. Make one day before serving.
