## **RECIPE OF THE MONTH**

**Tomato Casserole** 

6 medium tomatoes, chopped 1 small, chopped onion 2 tsp. sugar 1/8 tsp. pepper 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese 1 tbsp. butter, melted 1/4 tsp. salt 1/2 cup dry breadcrumbs

#### **Directions:**

In a large bowl, combine tomatoes, onion, sugar, salt and pepper. Transfer to a 2 qt. baking dish coated with cooking spray. Combine the breadcrumbs, Parmesan cheese and butter, sprinkle over the tomato mixture. Bake, uncovered, at 350 degrees for 25 to 30 minutes until the casserole is golden brown. Serving size 6
