PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Good job American Water! Following a look at our potable water, a tour and photo session of Town Creek from one end to the other was a surprise request. A follow up letter requested removal of an old pipe and was critical of the condition of the vegetation on common property which fronts both sides of the creek. Criticism specifically pointed to bare soil areas and locations where vegetation had been "cut to bare ground". A follow up inspection is to be scheduled!

Please remember if your lot backs up to Town Creek; the land between your lot and the creek is "common property" and must be kept in compliance with Georgia law, especially as it relates to the classification "trout streams". Removing or severe trimming of vegetation is a no, no. Don't do it!

Vegetation reminds me that I enjoyed cutting my grass for the first time in months. The grass was dry and the cooler breezes kept me smiling. It seems that Fall is just around the corner. Enjoy our much improved weather!

RECIPES

Baked Vidalia Onion by Diane Maxwell

I large Vidalia sweet onion I beef or chicken bouillon cube 1 tablespoon butter

Core onion. Fill hollow with bouillon cube and butter. Cook for 10 minutes in covered corning ware dish on high in microwave, or bake in oven for 45 minutes on 350 degrees. Wrap in foil before baking.

Peanut Butter Fudge Pie by Barbara Mushlin

1 chocolate pie crust (Ingles)

12 oz container of Cool Whip

1 cup creamy peanut butter ½ c sugar (or ¼ c Splenda and ¼ c sugar)

8 ounces cream cheese 1 jar of hot fudge topping (Smuckers)

Combine the peanut butter, sugar, and cream cheese in a bowl. Beat until smooth. Add in 3 cups of Cool Whip. Beat until all is mixed well. Spoon mixture into pie crust. Place in freezer for 10 minutes. Save 2 tablespoons of the fudge topping, and put the rest into a microwave safe bowl and microwave for 45 seconds. Remove and stir. Take pie from freezer and spread hot fudge over the pie to cover the peanut butter layer. Put back in the freezer for 15 minutes. Then spread the remaining Cool Whip over the hot fudge layer. Put back in the freezer for 10 minutes. Place the 2 tablespoons fudge topping in a sandwich bag and microwave for 10 seconds. (Knead the topping to soften further, if it needs to.) Cut a tiny hole in the corner of the bag. Remove the pie from the freezer and drizzle the topping in a decorative design over the pie. Put back in the freezer. When hard, cover gently. Before serving, put in the fridge for 1 hour. (Can be kept frozen for several weeks.) Makes 8 servings.

Broccoli Salad by Patti Gareau

I head broccoli florets ½ c raisins

12 strips of bacon, cooked crisp and crumbled I c mayo 1 cup sunflower seeds 1/3 c sugar

1 small sweet onion, chopped fine 2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar

Mix the first 5 ingredients together. In separate bowl mix the last 3 ingredients together and then toss the two together
