FINANCALS:

We have spent a lot of money this season on updating the campground's infrastructure, and as a result have spent approximately \$72,000 of reserve funds over the last three years.

The board as a result has voted to increase the maintenance fee to \$536.00 per year. This will continue to eliminate the need for special assessments in the near future.

In addition, it was decided to return to the old way of charging for trailer space rentals. The charge will now be \$10.00 per month with a total charge of \$120.00. This will give the owner the right to reserve their spot for the next year. This charge will be billed with your yearly maintenance charges. There are currently no spots available, however the board is looking into trying to add some additional spots.

WATER & SEWER COMMITTEE:

Valve Signs – All of the valve signs for side one and side two have been made except for 5 that had mistakes on them. They are being remade and should be ready by August 25. Shortly thereafter you should see Ken, Rory, Joe and myself planting flags throughout the park. Our water systems seem to be in good shape at this point. One note to keep in mind – we have had to replace the main cut off valves on several lots through the last several months due to handles breaking off. If you have not replaced your valve recently, now is a good time to check it out. Otherwise, when you try to turn off your water at the end of this season it may break and delay your departure.

We have not had any emergencies related to any sewer system in a while. As reported earlier four lift stations on side two have been updated with two remaining on side two to be dealt with. I expect North Georgia Environmental to be back to work with the two remaining soon.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH:



Apple Butter Pork Loin

Prep 15 min Cook 3 hrs. Ready in 3 hrs. 15 min

"This is the best pork recipe I've ever made. This pork is seasoned with a spiced apple butter, and roasted in apple juice. If food can be warm and cozy, this is it--a great Sunday dish!"

Ingredients

2 (2 pound) boneless pork loin roast seasoning salt to taste 2 cups apple juice 1/2 cup apple butter 1/4 cup brown sugar 2 tablespoons water 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves

Directions

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

- 1. Season the pork loins with seasoning salt, and place them in a 9x13 inch baking dish or small roasting pan. Pour apple juice over the pork, and cover the dish with a lid or aluminum foil.
- 2. Bake for 1 hour in the preheated oven. While the

pork is roasting, mix together the apple butter, brown sugar, water, cinnamon, and cloves. Remove pork roasts from the oven, and spread with apple butter mixture. Cover, and return to the oven for 2 hours, or until forktender.

And to top off a great dinner...try this easy and delicious dessert:



Great Pumpkin Dessert

"This is a very easy cake made with canned pumpkin and yellow cake mix. Serve with vanilla ice cream or whipped cream "

Ingredients

1 (15 ounce) can pumpkin puree

1 (12 fluid ounce) can evaporated milk

3 eggs

1 cup white sugar

4 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice

1 (18.25 ounce) package yellow cake mix

3/4 cup butter, melted

1 1/2 cups chopped walnuts

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a 9x13 inch baking pan.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine pumpkin, milk, eggs, sugar and spice. Mix well, and pour into a 9x13 inch pan.
- 3. Sprinkle dry cake mix over the top, then drizzle with melted butter. Top with walnuts.

Bake at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 1 hour or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean.

Be aware of where you put your garbage bags! People have put them on top of their cars and driven away and forgotten them, only to have them fall off over the park roads


or on Paradise Valley Road.

Habersham Winery has been producing wine since 1983 and offers complimentary tastings. Tours are available but must be arranged in advance, but the production area is visible in the tasting room so you can get a peek behind the scenes. Habersham sources from multiple vineyards in north Georgia and produces three different lines of wine. Habersham Winery is located at 7025 S. Main Street (Highway 75), Helen, GA. Hours are Monday - Saturday 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. and Sunday 12:30 p.m.- 6:00 p.m.

Yonah Mountain Vineyards, one of Georgia's newest vineyards, was founded in 2005 and has a tasting room that offers full and partial tastings for a small fee. The vineyard has three lines of wine and also has a wine club for fans of the brand. On Saturdays, visitors can tour Georgia's only wine cave and get an exclusive barrel sampling of upcoming wines.
