WHAT'S COOK'N'?

Cider-Braised Chicken, Brussel Sprouts and Apples

(4 Servings)

INGREDIENTS

- 4 slices bacon, chopped
- ❖ 8 bone-in, skin-on chicken thighs (about 3 1/2 pounds total)
- 2 medium tart red apples, cored and cut into wedges
- ❖ 1-12 ounce bottle hard cider
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh thyme
- 2 tablespoons whole grain mustard
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 12 ounces fresh Brussels sprouts, trimmed and halved if large (2 cups)

DIRECTIONS

- ✓ In a very large skillet cook bacon over medium heat until crisp; remove from pan, reserving drippings in skillet. Add chicken, skin side down, and cook 10 minutes or until browned, turning once; remove from skillet. Add apples to the skillet and cook 4 minutes or until browned on both sides; remove from skillet. Drain and discard drippings from skillet.
- ✓ Add cider, thyme, mustard, and salt to skillet, scraping up any browned bits. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Return chicken to skillet. Cover and simmer 10 minutes. Add Brussels sprouts. Cover and cook 5 minutes. Add apples and cook, uncovered, 3 to 5 minutes more or until chicken is done (at least 175 degrees F).
- ✓ To serve, divide chicken thighs, Brussels sprouts, and apples among shallow bowls or plates. Spoon cider mixture over top. Sprinkle each serving with bacon.

GEORGIA DNR (Department of Natural Resources)

Prohibits any and ALL changes made to the creeks and streams. Trees or vegetation cannot be removed from the side of the creek. Clearing can be done up



on the top of the bank. This means that moving rocks or natural vegetation and dumping debris of any kind into the waterways are illegal. Please be aware the county has, in the past, issued fines for these violations within the park.

GARBAGE: The Dumpsters (by the mailboxes) are for Household Waste Only. Break down all boxes flat that are to be placed in the dumpsters. Garbage pickup is Tuesdays and Fridays. Items other than household waste; chairs, tables, small appliances, flowerpots, old wood, etc. need to be taken to the Roll Off dumpster located down by the

trailer storage area. If the gate is locked, this means the roll-off is full. Please do not leave items around the roll-off or at the gate. Hold on to them, check with a board member to



find out when it will be emptied, and place it in the roll-off at that time. If you rent your property, please be sure your renters understand where their garbage should go.



Quiet Time: Quiet time within the park is 11 p.m. until 8 a.m. Using motorized equipment or creating loud noises during those times are prohibited. Think of your neighbors please!!

PLEASE DO NOT LET "STRANGERS" TAILGATE THROUGH

THE GATE! Please look for the Paradise Valley

Campground sticker on the driver's side lower corner

windshield before you let them in. If you do not see the sticker and you do not recognize them, please **POLITELY** ask what lot they are on and/or whom they are trying to reach. Keep in



mind that most cell service does not work within the park and if they are trying to reach someone it could be difficult. Please be diligent yet polite!

Coffee Cupping

Cupping is a formal coffee tasting technique used to evaluate coffee's fragrance, aroma, taste, body, and

aftertaste. We evaluate our coffee at our Cleveland, Georgia roasting facility before the coffee goes to market. Our cupping samples consist of pouring hot water directly onto a light roasted ground coffee in a small cup. This is where the full complexity of coffee is acquired. Typically, the fragrances and aromas that are found in light and medium roast are burned off at darker roasts leaving the more intense acidity flavors and stronger aromas. Every cupping session is critically important as a part of meeting JumpinGoat's rigorous quality standards.

Fragrance: Assessing the smell of the grounds before water is added is referred to as the fragrance of coffee.

Aroma: After the coffee has steeped for approximately 3

minutes, we break the crust that has formed on top of the water with a cupping spoon. Taking a deep sniff into the nasal cavity, we evaluated the burst of the coffee's aromas. Flavor: We evaluate the flavor of coffee by taking some coffee into the spoon and slurping the coffee strongly to aspirate it over the entire tongue. If you have never seen a cupping session, you're missing out on a fun observation for obvious reasons. Many cuppers have their own unique aspirating techniques, and they aspirate very strongly

Aspirating also helps the nose to detect due to the aromatic compounds in coffee.

because it is best practice to cover the entire tongue.
